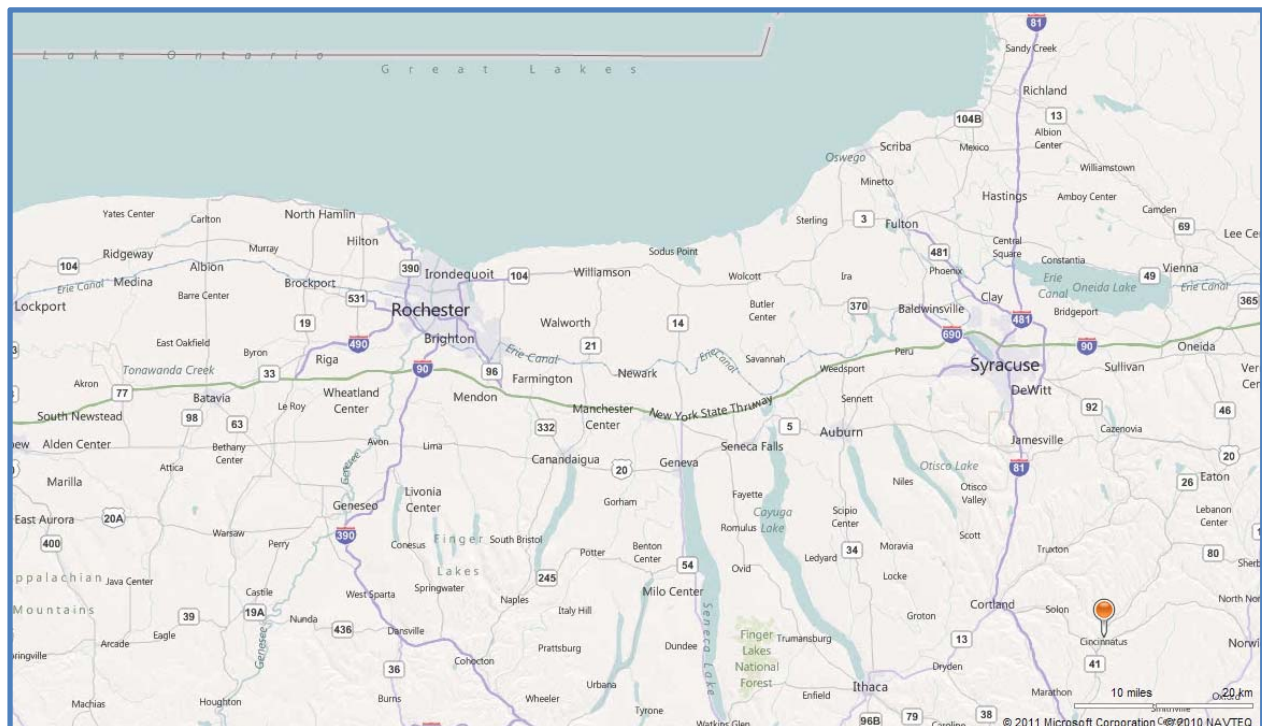
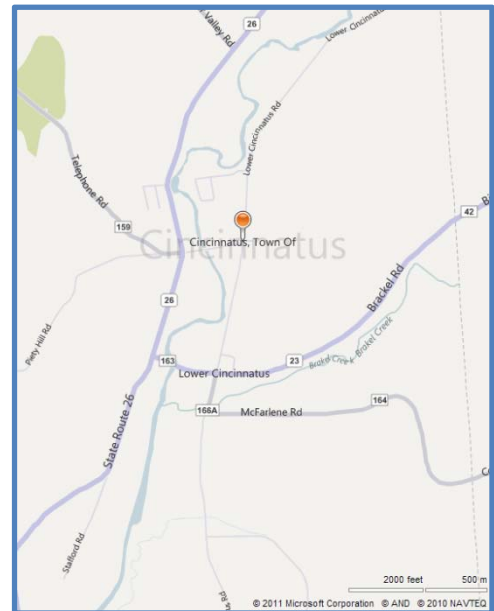

PROJECT LOCATION

The project is located in Broome County, along a section of the Susquehanna River from the Snake Creek confluence, past the Villages of Conklin and Kirkwood, to the Route 17 bridge.



PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project consists of channel improvement over a seven-mile reach, extending from Binghamton upstream past the Villages of Conklin and Kirkwood to the junction of Snake Creek. Initial work consisted of the removal of all trees and brush from approximately 130 acres of channel, islands, and river banks augmented by the removal of bars and islands in the mainstream at the mouth of four tributaries.

AUTHORIZATION

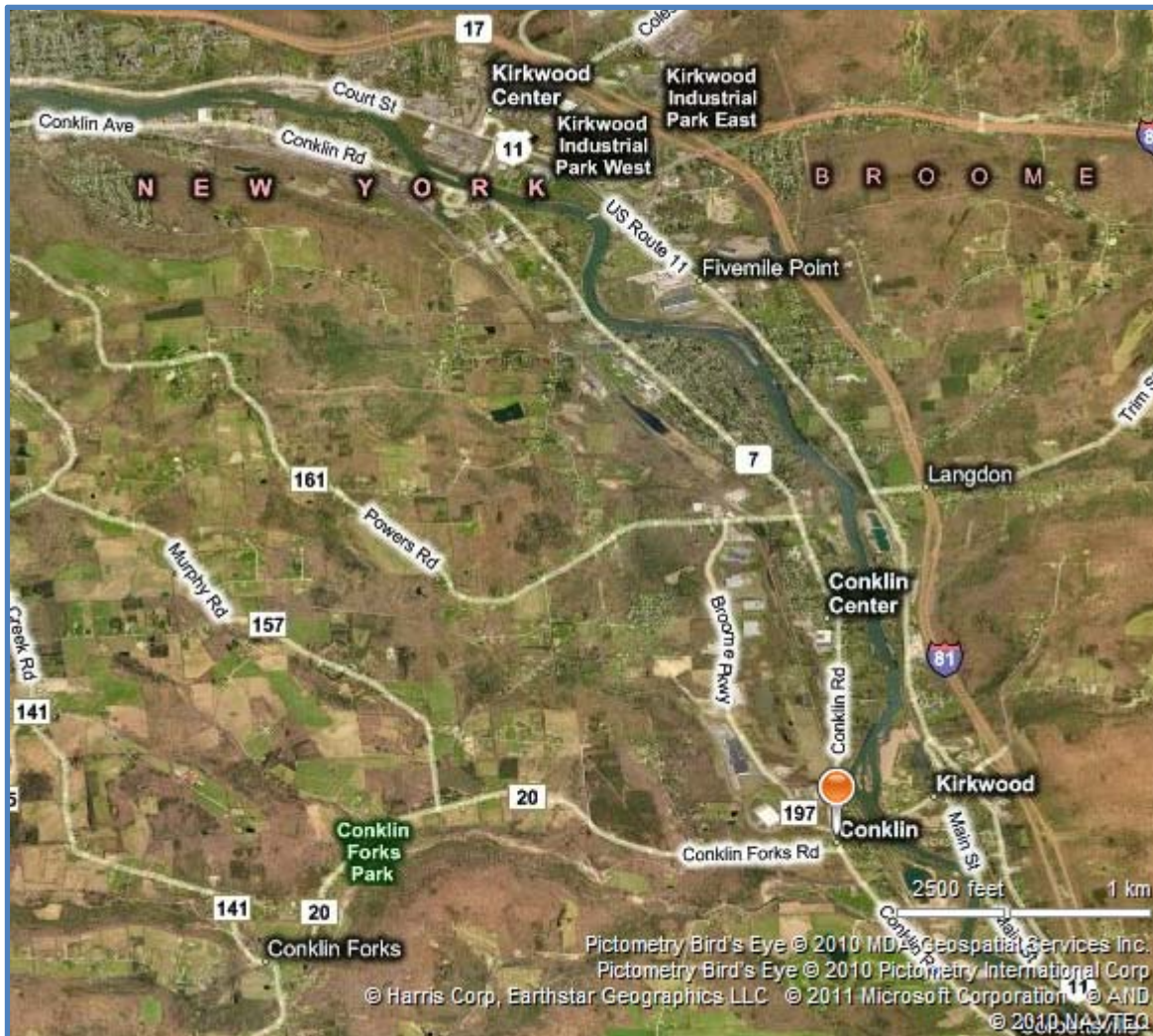
The project was adopted under the authority of Section 205 of the Flood Control Act of June 30th, 1948 (Public Law 80-858), as amended by Section 212 of the Flood Control Act of May 17th, 1950 (Public Law 81-516).

CONSTRUCTION

Construction of this project was completed in 1955. The Federal cost of new work was \$71,000. The reported cost to local interests was \$15,000.
