

RESOLUTION NO. 281

ESTABLISHING A NEW FEE SCHEDULE RELATING TO  
SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL IN MADISON COUNTY

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, The following commercial fee schedule shall be adopted by the Board;

- 1) No business, collector or contractor, including municipalities and educational institutions shall dispose of solid waste (as defined in New York State Department of Environmental Conservation regulation 6 NYCRR Part 360) at the County owned Westside Sanitary Landfill unless such person or entity shall pay a tipping fee. Such fee shall be computed at a rate of \$58.00 (fifty eight dollars) per ton, or in the event that weighing scales at the landfill are for any reason inoperable, at \$14.50 (fourteen dollars & fifty cents) per cubic yard of solid waste capacity of the delivery vehicle, except that delivery of less than half the load capacity will pay half the fee computed on the total vehicle capacity. The County's attendant shall be the judge of whether the load is less than half the vehicle's capacity. Tipping fees will be billed monthly by the County to collectors holding an annual permit and shall be paid within 30 days of the mailing of the fee statement. The minimum monthly tipping fee charge will be \$5.00 (five dollars). Failure to make payment when due shall result in suspension or revocation of discretion of the Director of the Department of Solid Waste and Sanitation. All such persons or entities disposing of such waste shall do so at the county landfill and shall not dispose of same at any county operated transfer station.

This fee schedule shall become effective on January 1, 1998.

RESOLUTION NO. 245

ESTABLISHING A NEW FEE SCHEDULE RELATING TO SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL IN MADISON COUNTY

WHEREAS, Section 3(h) of Local Law No. 5 of 1991 establishes a fee schedule for disposal of solid waste at the County owned landfill; and


WHEREAS, Section 3(1) of said local law requires that the Board of Supervisors amend fee schedules for disposal of solid waste at the County owned landfill; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Solid Waste and Sanitation and the Solid Waste and Recycling Committee and the Madison County Treasurer have recommended changing the commercial tipping fee for disposal of solid waste at the County owned landfill from \$75.00 per ton to \$60.00 per ton effective January 1, 1996;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Madison to amend said Local Law No. 5 of 1991 by substituting the following text for Paragraph 3(h) therein as follows:

"No business, collector or contractor, including municipalities and educational institutions, shall dispose of solid waste at a county owned landfill unless such person or entity shall pay a tipping fee as herein provided. Such fee shall be computed at the rate of \$60.00 per ton, or in the event that weighing scales at the landfill are for any reason not operable, at the rate of \$15.00 per cubic yard of solid waste capacity of the delivery vehicle, except that a delivery of less than half the load capacity will pay half the fee computed on the total capacity. The County's attendant shall be the judge of whether the load is less than half the vehicle's capacity. - Tipping fees will be billed monthly by the County to collectors holding an annual permit and shall be paid within thirty days of the mailing of the fee statement. The minimum monthly tipping fee charge will be \$5.00. Failure to make payments when due shall result in suspension or revocation of the collector's permit, unless excused for good reason at the discretion of the Solid Waste Director. All such persons or entities disposing of such waste shall do so at the County landfill and shall not dispose of same at any County operated transfer station."


ADOPTING LOCAL LAW NO. 3 FOR THE YEAR 1994


RESOLUTION NO. 218

ESTABLISHING A NEW FEE SCHEDULE  
RELATING TO SOLID WASTE  
DISPOSAL IN MADISON COUNTY

WHEREAS, in order for Madison County to pay the Principal and Interest payments on a bond issued for the purpose of constructing a new landfill, an increase in the solid waste tipping fee must be made to pay off the bonded debt service:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Madison as follows:

- 1) Solid Waste Punch Cards shall be purchased from the Solid Waste Departments Authorized County Agents and Clerks of the town, city or village in which such resident resides at the following rate: Punch Card of 5/\$7.50 with the Clerk, on behalf of the selling municipality, or the agent retaining \$.25 per card sold.  
Punch Cards issued after January 1, 1994 shall be valid until and expire on the last day of January of the year following the year of issuance.
- 2) No business, collector or contractor, including municipalities and educational institutions, shall dispose of solid waste at a county owned landfill unless such person or entity shall pay a tipping fee as herein provided. Such fee shall be computed at a rate of \$75.00 per ton, or in the event that weighing scales at the landfill are for any reason not operable, at \$18.75 per cubic yard of solid waste capacity of the delivery vehicle, except that a delivery of less than half the load capacity will pay half the fee computed on total capacity. The County's attendant shall be the judge of whether the load is less than half the vehicle's capacity. Tipping fees will be billed monthly by the County to collectors holding an annual permit and shall be paid within thirty days of the mailing of the fee statement. The minimum monthly tipping fee charge will be \$5.00. Failure to make payments when due shall result in suspension or revocation of the collector's permit, unless excused for good reason at the discretion of the Solid Waste Director. All such persons or entities disposing of such waste shall do so at the county landfill and shall not dispose of same at any county operated transfer station.
- 3) This fee schedule shall become effective January 1, 1994.

RESOLUTION NO. 36

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A FEE FOR DISPOSING OF  
REFRIGERATION UNITS AT THE MADISON COUNTY  
LANDFILL AND TRANSFER STATIONS

WHEREAS, The United States Clean Air Act requires that, effective July 1, 1992, all CFC Refrigerants (FREON) must be removed from all refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers and air conditioners prior to the disposal of such items or their delivery for recycling; and


WHEREAS, in order to meet the requirements of The Clean Air Act, Madison County has hired E.P.A. certified companies to properly evacuate and recover the CFC gas from all refrigeration units prior to recycling; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in order for Madison County to pay for the CFC recovery program, a special CFC recovery processing fee shall be collected by the Department of Solid Waste and Sanitation. The following fee schedule shall apply:

- 1) Residential permit holders shall present two (2) five hole punch cards to the attendant for each refrigeration unit disposed of at the landfill or transfer stations.
- 2) Commercial permit holders shall be billed at \$12.50 for each refrigeration unit disposed of at the landfill or transfer stations.
- 3) One day permit holders shall pay \$12.50 by check or cash for each refrigeration unit disposed of at the landfill site.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the refrigeration disposal fee become effective March 2, 1993.



- 6) 1993 yellow punch cards



A RESOLUTION AMENDING LOCAL LAW NO. 5 OF 1991  
ALLOWING FOR COLLECTION OF INTEREST ON  
OVERDUE COMMERCIAL ACCOUNTS

WHEREAS, Local Law No. 5 of 1991 was adopted in order to govern the disposal and recycling of solid waste in Madison County; and

WHEREAS, Section III, Sub-Section 3, Disposal of Solid Waste, paragraph h sets tipping fees for Commercial Waste Haulers; and

WHEREAS, Sub-Section 3 paragraph 1 states that Commercial Waste Permit Holders will be billed monthly by the County of Madison and that such bills must be paid within 30 days of the mailing of the fee statement; and

WHEREAS, the County of Madison has experienced certain delinquencies in its accounts receivable, the collection of which would be aided by the imposition of interest on overdue accounts; and

WHEREAS, Section III, Sub-Section 3, paragraph 1 allows amendment of all Solid Waste disposal requirements specified in Sub-Section 3 of Local Law No. 5 of 1992, by resolution of the Board of Supervisors;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the last sentence of Section III, Sub-Section 3, paragraph 1 of Local Law No. 5 be amended to read: "Pursuant to Section IV of this local law failure to make payments when due shall result in suspension or revocation of the Commercial Waste Permit or Special Waste Permit and will also result in the accrual of interest on such past due amount at the rate of 1½% per month, effective March 1, 1993."

ADDING TEXTILES AND TELEPHONE BOOKS TO THE LIST  
OF DESIGNATED RECYCLABLES

WHEREAS, on October 8, 1991 Madison County (the "County") adopted Local Law No. 7 of 1991 (the "Local Law") restating and amending Local Law No. 3 of 1990; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Law, the County Board of Supervisors (the "Board") may, by resolution, designate recyclable materials from certain sources for delivery and disposition at the A.R.C. Recycling Facility in the County or such other facility as the County's Department of Solid Waste and Sanitation (the "Department") shall designate from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Board proposes to make such designation;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby designates that "textiles" and "telephone books" shall be "Designated Recyclables" as that term is defined and applied in the Local Law and shall take effect April 1, 1993; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hereby directs that the Department give such notice of this Resolution and take such other steps as the Department deems necessary or appropriate consistent with the Resolution to give effect to the Local Law.



RESOLUTION NO. 169

ESTABLISHING A NEW FEE SCHEDULE  
RELATING TO SOLID WASTE  
DISPOSAL IN MADISON COUNTY

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Madison as follows:

- 1) Solid Waste Punch Cards shall be purchased from the Landfill Authorized County Agents and Clerks of the town, city or village in which such resident resides at the following rate: Punch Card of 5/\$6.25 with the Clerk, on behalf of the selling municipality, or the agent retaining \$.25 per card sold. Each Punch Card of 5 punches shall be equivalent to one book of 5 coupons. Punch Cards issued after January 1, 1993 shall be valid until and expire on the last day of January of the year following the year of issuance.
- 2) No business, collector or contractor, including municipalities and educational institutions, shall dispose of solid waste at a county owned landfill unless such person or entity shall pay a tipping fee as herein provided. Such fee shall be computed at a rate of \$64.00 per ton, or in the event that weighing scales at the landfill are for any reason not operable at \$16.00 per cubic yard of solid waste capacity of the delivery vehicle, except that a delivery of less than half the load capacity will pay half the fee computed on total capacity. The County's attendant shall be the judge of whether the load is less than half the vehicle's capacity. Tipping fees will be billed monthly by the County to collectors holding an annual permit and shall be paid within thirty days of the mailing of the fee statement. The minimum monthly tipping fee charge will be \$5.00. Failure to make payments when due shall result in suspension or revocation of the collector's permit, unless excused for good reason at the discretion of the Solid Waste Director. All such persons or entities disposing of such waste shall do so at the county landfill and shall not dispose of same at any county operated transfer station.
- 3) This fee schedule shall become effective January 1, 1993.
